

***ORDINANCE- B.A. LL.B (FIVE- YEAR) INTEGRATED COURSE EXAMINATION
(Semester System)**

- 1.1** The duration of the course leading to the Degree of B.A. LL.B. shall be five academic years. Each year shall be divided into two semesters i.e. July to November/December and January to April/May. Each semester shall have minimum 90 teaching days. The examination for the First, Third, Fifth, Seventh and Ninth semesters shall ordinarily be held in the month of December/January and for the Second, Fourth, Sixth, Eighth and Tenth semesters in the month of May/June on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice Chancellor.
- 1.2\$** Supplementary Examinations for the first, third, fifth, seventh and ninth semesters shall be held in December/January and for the second, fourth, sixth, eighth and tenth semesters in May/June, on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations **(w.e.f. the session 2009-10)**
- 1.3** The last date(s) by which the admission forms and fees must reach the Controller of Examinations shall be as fixed by this University.
- 2.1+** A person who has passed the Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) with at least five subjects from a recognized Board of School Education, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto, securing not less than 45% marks **(42% marks for OBC Category)** in the aggregate with English as one of the subjects, shall be eligible to seek admission in the First semester of B.A LL.B (5 -Year) course.
- 2.2** The minimum eligibility condition in the case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidates shall be 40% marks in the qualifying examination.
£ The candidates should not be more than 20 years of age as on 31st December of the year of admission (relaxable by two years for SC, ST and OBC candidates)
- 3.** The examination of Semester I/II/III/IV/V/VI/VII/VIII/IX/X, shall be open to a candidate whose name has been submitted to the Controller of Examinations through the Head of the Dept. of Law and produces the following certificate(s) signed by the Head of the department:-
- (a) of having remained on the rolls of the Department for the Semester concerned preceding the examination;
- (b) **≠**of having attended not less than **70%** of the classes held in each subject including moot court exercises, tutorials, practical training (course to be counted upto the date of commencement of the preparatory holidays). However, in exceptional cases, it can be relaxed to a minimum of **65%** in the subject concerned and **70%** of classes in all the subjects taken together, by the Head of the department, as per BCI instructions.

Explanation:

§ For the purpose of counting of the last date when the classes shall break up for preparatory holidays, first day of the commencement of any semester examination will apply to all semester examinations and all semester classes will have the preparatory holidays from the same date viz. 7 days before the date on which the first examination of any semester commences.

4. Candidates shall be examined according to the Scheme of Examination and Syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. A candidate who fails in an examination, or having been eligible, fails to appear in an examination, shall unless approved otherwise by the Academic Council, take the examination according to the syllabus prescribed for regular students appearing for the examination.

5. Each written paper for the respective semester Examination shall be set and evaluation of the answer books shall be done as per procedure laid down by this University.

6.1@ Out of 100 marks, there shall be 80 marks for Theory paper(s) and 20 marks for Internal Assessment for each Theory paper, except for the practical papers. The break-up of Internal Assessment shall be, as under:-

(i)	Written Tests	- 10 marks
(ii)	Assignments (written with oral Presentation)	-06 marks
(iii)	Attendance (above 70% - one mark for every 5% increase)	-04 marks

6.2 The Head of the department shall forward the marks of internal assessment obtained by the candidates to the Controller of Examinations ****seven days before the commencement** of written examination. The Head of the department will preserve the records of the internal assessment/practical, for inspection, if needed by the University upto six months from the date of declaration of the concerned semester examination results.

6.3 ® The marks of internal assessment obtained by the candidate who has to re-appear **for** passing the examination shall be carried forward for next examination. He/she will, however, have the option to improve his/her marks of internal assessment.

7.1 ® The minimum number of marks to pass the examination in each semester shall be 45% in each Theory or Practical Paper separately.

7.2 ® The candidate is required to obtain pass marks in each of the Theory paper in aggregate of the external and internal assessment subject to obtaining pass marks separately in each paper of external written examination.

8. A candidate, who fails in a semester examination shall be exempted from re-appearing in the paper(s) in which he/she may have obtained at least 45% marks. Such a candidate shall be allowed to appear, for passing in the remaining paper(s), only at the next two respective semester examinations to be held in immediate after the examination in which he appeared and failed or having been eligible, did not appear.

Provided that a candidate for the B.A LL.B.(Integrated) Degree must pass all the examinations, i.e. Semester I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX and X within seven years of his admission to the first semester of the course failing which he will be deemed to be unfit for the course.

- 9.1 A candidate who has appeared and failed or having been eligible did not appear in the I, III, V, VII and IX Semester examination shall be promoted from I to II, III to IV, V to VI, VII to VIII and IX to X Semester, as the case may be, subject to the provision of Clause 9.2 below.
- 9.2 A candidate who has failed in Semesters I and II or III and IV or V and VI or VII and VIII shall be promoted to the III, V, VII and IX Semester, as the case may be, provided he/she has attended the required number of lectures during the previous semester course and only if he has got exemption in the paper(s) mentioned below:

From I year (Semester I & II) to II year (Semester III)	§ If he has cleared at least 50% papers of Semesters I & II.
From II year (Semester III & IV) to III year (Semester V)	§ If he has cleared at least 50% papers of Semesters I & II, and at least 50% papers of Semesters III & IV.
From III year (Semester V & VI) to IV year (Semester VII)	§ If he has passed all the papers of Semester I and II and has cleared at least 50% papers of Semester III & IV and at least 50% papers of Semesters V & VI.
From IV year (Semester VII & VIII) to V year (Semester IX)	§ If he has passed all the papers of Semesters I, II, III and IV, and cleared at least 50% papers of Semester V & VI and at least 50% papers of Semesters VII and VIII.

10. The candidates whose result is declared late for no fault of theirs may be allowed to attend the classes of the next higher semester provisionally at their own risk and responsibility, subject to their passing the concerned semester examination/earning exemption in the requisite number of papers as provided in Clauses 8 & 9 above.
11. The amount of examination fee to be paid by a regular/re-appear candidate for each semester shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.
12. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.

13. The Controller of Examinations shall publish the result and issue Detailed-Marks-Cards soon after the declaration of the result of the Examination.
14. The candidates who successfully complete the five-year B.A.LL.B. Course will be awarded Degree of B.A.LL.B (Integrated). The list of successful candidates shall be prepared on the aggregate marks obtained in all the ten semesters examinations and shall be arranged as under:-
- (a) Those who obtain 60% or more marksFirst Division.
- (b) Those who obtain 45% or more marks
but less than 60% marksSecond Division.

The candidates who pass the examination in the first attempt and within a minimum duration of the course i.e. 5 years, after obtaining 75% or more marks of the total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with '**Distinction**'.

15. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of the course, which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins the course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance and amended Ordinance, if any shall unless specified otherwise, apply to all students whether old or new.
