

***ORDINANCE - CERTIFICATE IN ORAL IMPLANTOLOGY EXAMINATION**
(Annual System) (w.e.f. the Session : 2009-10)

- 1.1 The duration of the course for Certificate in Oral Implantology shall be one Academic year.
- 1.2 The examination shall be held once a year ordinarily in the month of June /July of the same year and the supplementary examination in the month of December/January on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 1.3 The last date(s) by which the examination forms and fees must reach the Controller of Examinations shall be as fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations.
2. A person who has passed BDS examination **or** equivalent qualifying examination recognized by the Dental Council of India shall be eligible to join the course of Certificate in Oral Implantology on the basis of merit of qualifying examination.
3. The examination shall be open to a candidate who:-
 - (a) has passed the requisite qualifying examination as laid down in Clause 2 above;
 - (b) has remained on the rolls of the Dental College during the academic year preceding the examination;
 - (c) has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the Principal of the Dental College and produces the following Certificates signed by him:-
 - (i) of good character ;
 - (ii) has attended not less than 75% of the full course of lectures delivered in each theory paper and practicals separately (to be counted upto the last day when the classes break up for the preparatory holidays, viz. one week before the commencement of the examination). A deficiency upto 5% of lectures, Clinical and Practical may be condoned by the Principal of the Dental College on reasonable grounds.
- 4.1 10% marks shall be reserved for Internal Assessment in theory papers and practicals separately.
- 4.2 The candidate is required to obtain pass marks in each of the Theory and Practical papers in aggregate of the external and internal assessment subject to obtaining pass marks separately in each paper of external examinations. The internal assessment award of any candidate who fails in one or more papers of any semester examination shall be carried forward to the next examination. He/she will, however, be allowed to improve his/her marks of internal assessment examinations at the time of appearing in the Re-appear Paper(s).

- 4.3 The Principal of the Dental College shall forward the Internal Assessment marks to the Controller of the Examinations at least one week before the commencement of Examination.
- 4.4 The Principal of the Dental College shall preserve the record of internal assessment, for inspection, if needed by the University, upto six months from the date of declaration of the result.
5. A candidate who has failed in one or more paper(s) or having been eligible fails to appear in the examination may be allowed to re-appear only thrice in the paper(s) at the subsequent examinations as specified in Clause 1 above. Such a candidate shall be exempted from re-appearing in paper(s) in which he has obtained at least 50% marks.
6. Every candidate shall be examined according to the Scheme of Examination and Syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. A candidate who fails in an examination shall take the examination according to the syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students appearing for that examination.
7. The question papers will be set and answer-books examined by the Single External Examiner.

There shall be two Internal Examiners. One Internal Examiner from the Department of Oral Surgery shall be the Co-ordinator of the Board of Examiners. The 2nd Internal Examiner shall be from the Department of Periodontics & Prosthodontics on an Annual Rotational Basis. The External Examiner shall therefore be either from Periodontics or from the Prosthodontics on an Annual Rotational Basis.

8. A candidate who fails to pass the Certificate course in Oral Implantology examination within a period of three years of his/her admission to the course, shall be deemed to be unfit for this course. However, if the candidate desires to pass the course after the prescribed period, he/she will be required to repeat the course de novo.
9. The examination fee to be paid by a regular / re-appear candidate shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.
10. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
11. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be:-
 - (i) 50% in theory including oral examination of each theory subject;
 - (ii) 50% in the aggregate of practical including clinical of each subject and Internal Assessment.

12. After the termination of examination, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the candidates and issue Detailed Marks Cards as expeditiously as possible.
13. The result of the candidates who have passed the Oral Implantology Certificate Course shall be classified into divisions on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in the examination as under and the division obtained by the candidate will be stated in his/her Certificate:-

(a) Those who obtain 60% or more marks First Division.

(b) Those who obtain 50% or more butSecond Division.
less than 60% marks

Candidates who pass the examination at the first attempt and with minimum duration of the course after obtaining 80% or more marks of the total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with '**Distinction.**'
