## \*ORDINANCE - BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (B. PHARM.) EXAMINATION (ANNUAL SYSTEM)

- 1.1 The duration of the course of Degree of Bachelor of Pharmacy shall be **four** years. The annual examinations shall be held in four parts, viz. Part-I at the end of the course of first year, Part II at the end of the Second year, Part III at the end of third year and Part-IV at the end of the fourth year, ordinarily in the month of April/May on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 1.2 Supplementary Examination for those students who have failed in one or more paper(s) shall be held ordinarily in the month of September/October on such dates as may be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 1.3 The last date(s) by which the examination forms and fees must reach the Controller of Examinations shall be as fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and\_notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 2.1 A person who has passed the following examination shall be eligible to join the first year of Bachelor of Pharmacy Course:

Senior Secondary Certificate (10+2) examination of a recognised Board/University having Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects with at least 50% marks in aggregate with one of subjects of\_Mathematics, Biotechnology, Computer Science and Biology (Botany & Zoology).

Or

Diploma in Pharmacy (**D. Pharm**) from a recognized University/Board with atleast 50% marks in aggregate.

- 2.2 A candidate who has passed Diploma in Pharmacy from a recognized University with minimum of 60% marks in the aggregate of all semesters/examinations from recognized University/Board will be admitted directly to Second Year provided that Diploma holders so admitted shall pass those subjects of B. Pharm.-First year which have not already been studied by them as a part of the Diploma course.
- 3. The examination shall be open to a regular student who:-
  - (a) has passed not less than one academic year previously the requisite qualifying examination as laid down in Clause 2 above;
  - (b) has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the Principal of the Pharmacy College and produces the following certificates signed by the Principal:-
    - (i) of good character
    - (ii) of having been remained on the rolls of the Pharmacy College recognized by this University during the academic year preceding the examination and of having attended not less than 75% of the full course of lectures delivered in each paper (the course to be counted upto the last day when the classes break up for the preparatory holidays).

However, the Principal of the College to his satisfaction may condone deficiency in lectures upto 10% in each paper of theory/practicals.

## **Explanation:**

For the purpose of counting of last date when the classes shall disperse for the preparatory holidays, first day of the commencement of examination will apply to all the examinations and classes for the four parts will have preparatory holidays from the same date, i.e. 7 days before the date of commencement of examination.

- 4.1 A person who has passed B. Pharmacy Part-I or Part-II or Part-III examination of this University shall be eligible to join Part-II or Part-III or Part-IV class respectively of B. Pharmacy course.
- 4.2 A candidate who fails in one or more papers of the B. Pharmacy Part-II or Part-III or Part-III examination, shall be promoted to B. Pharmacy Part-II or Part-III or Part-IV, as the case may be, only in the following manner:-

From Part-I to Part-II If he/she has secured 50% marks (theory and Practical

separately) in at least 50% papers of B. Pharmacy Part-I

examinations.

From Part-II to Part-III If he/she has secured 50% marks (theory and Practical

separately) in at least 50% papers of B. Pharmacy Part-II

examinations.

From Part-III to Part-IV If he/she has passed all papers of B. Pharmacy Part-I and

secured 50% marks (theory and practical separately) in at least

50% papers of Part-II and Part-III examinations.

5.1 20% marks in each paper (theory and practical separately) will be reserved for internal assessment. In theory papers, these marks will be based upon the average of marks obtained in two best of the three sessional examinations conducted during academic year. The marks for internal assessment in theory papers for attendance will be awarded proportionate to attendance.

In the case of practical, 50% marks will be based upon day-to-day assessment of practical work, viva, attendance and laboratory records etc. and 50% on the basis of sessional practical examinations at the end of the year.

- 5.2 The Principal of the College shall forward the internal assessment marks on the basis of two best of three house examinations, attendance, practical note book, day—to-day viva-voce etc. to the Controller of Examinations at least one week before the commencement of examination.
- 5.3 The Principal of the College shall preserve the records on the basis of which the internal assessment awards have been prepared, for inspection, if needed by the University upto six months from the date of declaration of the examination results.
- 5.4\*\* The candidate is required to obtain Pass marks in each of Theory and Practical papers in aggregate of the external and internal assessment/sessionals subject to obtaining pass marks separately in each paper of external examinations. The internal assessment award of any candidate who fails in one or more papers of any semester examination shall be carried forward to the next examination. He/she will, however, be allowed to improve his/her marks of sessional examinations at the time of appearing in the 'Reappear' papers.

- 6. Every candidate shall be examined according to the Scheme of Examination and Syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. A candidate who fails in an examination, or, having been eligible, fails to appear in an examination shall take the examination according to the Syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students appearing for that examination.
- 7. The candidate must pass the whole course within a period of seven years of his/her admission to the first year of the course. A candidate who fails to pass the Bachelor of Pharmacy Course within a period of seven years of his/her admission to the course shall be deemed to be unfit for the course.
- 8. The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each part shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.

A candidate who re-appears in one or more paper(s)/practical(s) for the purpose of passing the same examination shall pay fee as for the whole examination.

- 9. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
- 10. After the termination of the examination, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the candidates and issue Detailed-Marks-Cards as expeditiously as possible.
- 11. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be as under:
  - (a) 50% in theory paper (including sessional);
  - (b) 50% in practical (including sessional);
- 12. For the purpose of division, the successful candidates of Part-I, Part-II, Part-III, Part-IV shall be classified, as under, on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in Part-I, Part-III, Part-III, Part-IV taken together, and the division obtained by the candidate will be stated in his degree:-
  - (a) Those who obtain 60% or more marks .. First Division.
  - (b) Those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% marks ... Second Division.
  - (c) Candidates who pass all the four parts at the first attempt and within a minimum duration of the course i.e. four years, obtaining 75% or more marks of the total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with 'Distinction'.
- 13. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of the Bachelor of Pharmacy course which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins course, shall hold good only for the examination (s) held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance subsequently and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all students whether old or new.
